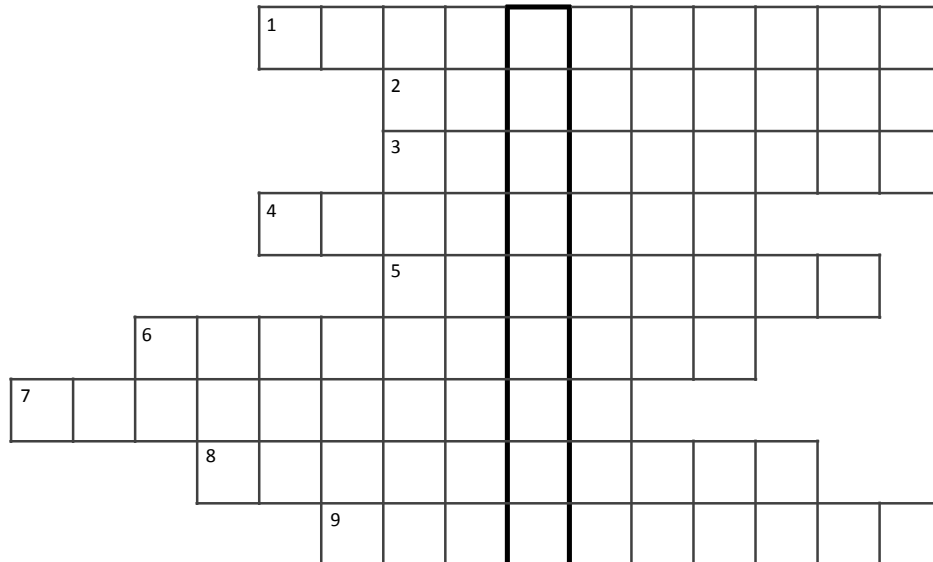


## 23 County highlights

Complete the table below by filling in the names of the Yorkshire locations and by so doing, discover something special about the county which runs down the grid.



1. It's famous for its cheese, much beloved by Wallace and Gromit. (11)
2. It's a port on the Dinosaur Coast which had its own group of artists in the 19th century, called the Northern Impressionists. (8)
3. It is the crocodile-shaped one of the three peaks and its name means Hill of Winds. (3,1,5)
4. This valley is best visited in spring when its wild daffodils come out. (8)
5. This valley nestles between the moors, below Blakey Ridge. (8)
6. This famous beauty spot in the Dales is like a rocky bowl with cliffs and a limestone pavement around the top. (6,4)
7. This place stands at the top end of a river valley and has a viaduct named after it on the Settle Carlisle line. (10)
8. It's the partly washed away coastal headland, which juts into the Humber Estuary. (5,5)
9. It's a well-known promontory in the North Sea, between Bridlington and Scarborough. (5,5)
